Federal Policy Updates & National News:

- Stay in the Loop: Afterschool Alliance Update Email
- Congressional Activity: FY26 allocations released and the Labor-HHS-Education bill cut by \$14 billion (7%), House Labor-HHS-Education action is pushed back to early September.
- Administrative updates: The Office of Management and Budget released 21st CCLC funds last Monday and on Friday they announced that the remainder of the federal funds will also be released.
 - State allocations for 21st CCLC grants can be found here.
 - States will be prohibited from using 21st CCLC funds to serve individuals who are not in the country legally. State Education Agencies are reviewing the additional requirements, and will be required to sign an agreement prior to distributing the funding. Legal challenges to these requirements are likely.
