Wisconsin News& Legislative Updates:

Administration cancels grants that support deafblind students, special education teachers

#### Federal Policy Updates & National News:

- Stay in the Loop: Afterschool Alliance Update Email
- Federal Update: Possible Shutdown & Funding Outlook
  - Shutdown risk: Without a continuing resolution by Oct. 1, the government could shut down.
  - Programs continuing: 21st CCLC, CCDF, and school meals are expected to continue, though uncertainty remains. AmeriCorps positions could be furloughed, and the Trump administration has indicated some roles may be eliminated.
  - Agency impact: Federal agencies that support afterschool may be unavailable during a shutdown.
  - Looking ahead: Both House and Senate proposals protect 21st CCLC at \$1.329B, but the House plan cuts overall education funding by 15%, including \$4.7B from Title I.
- Congressional Activity:
  - Senate FY 2026 appropriations bill protects most federal education funding, including 21st CCLC.
  - House version preserves 21st CCLC but makes <u>deep cuts to</u> <u>Title I, Community Schools, and other key programs</u>.
- Administrative updates:
  - Youth Mentoring Funds at Risk: Some of the FY25 Youth Mentoring grants at the Department of Justice have now been released. Programs that support or promote DEI efforts will not receive their funding.
