Wisconsin News& Legislative Updates:

- WI public school enrollment declining

Federal Policy Updates & National News:

- Stay in the Loop: Afterschool Alliance Update Email
- Congressional Update:
 - Government Shutdown & Afterschool Impacts
 - The government shutdown is now in its fourth week with no agreement to reopen.
 - A bipartisan group led by Sen. Shaheen (D-NH) is working on a compromise, but no deal has been reached.

Program Impacts

- Most K–12 funding continues, but Impact Aid is on hold for about 1,000 districts.
- Head Start is affected.
- School meal funding may run out in November.

Legislative & Policy Updates

- The Healthy Meals Help Kids Learn Act (Rep. McGovern, D-MA) would increase federal reimbursement by \$0.45 per lunch and \$0.28 per breakfast, with annual adjustments.
- A new proposal would allow tax deductions for part-time use of property for 21st CCLC programs, helping districts secure space.

Administrative updates:

- **ED Layoffs:** On Oct. 10, the U.S. Department of Education laid off 450 staff as part of a government-wide RIF affecting 4,000 employees. <u>Read more here.</u>
 - Impacted offices include OCR, Special Education, and OESE.
 - All remaining 21st CCLC staff were laid off. One nonfederal fellow may remain.
 - A court ruling may allow some staff to return after the shutdown ends.

• 21st CCLC Impact:

- Staff reduced from six in January to zero.
- Layoffs affect fee waivers, data collection, and reporting, but not grant competitions—some states are proceeding.

• Afterschool Alliance Response:

- Statement from Jodi Grant and an Action Alert to Congress urging reinstatement of ED staff.
- Two new ED grant priorities posted for comment:
 - **Meaningful Learning:** Literacy and numeracy to improve NAEP scores.
 - Career and Workforce: Career-connected learning and workforce skill development.

National News

- Demand for afterschool programs outpaces supply as cost becomes growing barrier
- Nearly 3 in 4 families lack after-school program access
- Afterschool programs effective but too expensive, survey says
